



2022 IJOC Website Number of Visits




2021 & 2022 Comparison - Number of Visits



Remuneration of Officials

- In 2022, the IJOC Board re-initiated the efforts to present an orchestrated proposal to the FEI.
- An in-person meeting was held at the FEI Headquarters in July, where other proposals about evaluation and appointments of officials were also highlighted.
- Following this meeting, The Equestrian Organisers (EO) and the IJOC have collaborated for a joint proposal.
- The proposal contained differentiation according to role and responsibility as well as level of the show.
- The process took about 7 months and there were more than 25 meetings held with stakeholders, The Board, FEI, EEF, and various other working groups. NFs were also contacted via email.
- Finally on the 13th of November 2022 at the FEI General Assembly, the proposal was approved.



Remuneration of Officials

ARTICLE 200

6.2.1.5. Per Diem (Daily Allowance) for all Officials except the Technical Delegate A minimum per diem allowance of minimum 120 Euros per day per Official as displayed below must be offered to all FEI Officials during the period of the Event. This remuneration for miscellaneous costs is to be provided net after relevant taxes being borne by the OC. A per diem will be paid in addition for a maximum total of one travel day if the Official's travel day(s) is/are different from the officiating days
